40	the membership and to be put to a vote by the membership at a future date.

43	<u>Carroll:</u> Page 8, Article 8 Committees: Propose changing lines A, B & C; removing line E.
44	<u>Current bylaw Line A says:</u> there shall be four standing committees which shall
45	be accountable, subject to the control and direction of the board: operations;
46	marketing and public relations; quality control; and finance. Each committee will
47	be governed by committee descriptions. Liaisons to the committees will be



48	appointed from within the board, by the board. Chairs for the respective
49	committees shall be chosen by the members who serve on them.
50	Proposed change to bylaw Line A: The board may appoint committees as
51	deemed necessary. There shall be one standing committee, Quality Control.
52	These committees will be subject to the control and direction of the board.
53	Liaisons to the committees will be appointed from within the board, by the
54	board.
55	Current bylaw Line B: All members shall be eligible to serve on standing
56	committees.
57	Proposed change to bylaw Line B: All members in good standing shall be eligible
58	to serve as committee volunteers without compensation

85	amount of weight in the lease]
